New initiative at Hartley College

Hartley College has been one of the leading educational institutions in Sri Lanka. The school has not only been popular for producing high academic achievers but also for producing leading sports personnel.

The recent civil war has had a great impact on school activities affecting badly the academic and sporting performances. After 2009 most of the parents appear to be solely focused in education for their children neglecting any investment of time in sports. Consequently tuition has become almost compulsory in a student's life at the expense of other activities at school. Most schools in the Northern Province are used as tuition centers in after school hours.

It is true that education should be the number one priority for our people in the current environment. However, sports and other extra-curricular activities are also important to students to become fully fledged future leaders. We (PPAs) have a role to sow the seeds of this awareness in the minds of parents, teachers and students. We believe by improving (or providing) the existing (or new) sporting facilities we will re-ignite interest in sporting activities that will benefit the students and school to achieve high standards in this area. (contd. from previous page....) Hartley College Past Pupil Association NSW (HCPPA NSW) has initiated a project called "Sporting Facility Improvement Project". We have come up with an action plan. The first step of this plan is to initiate a feasibility study with the objective to prepare a staged implementation plan to:

- improve the condition of playing field and sporting facilities; and
- introduce appropriate new sporting facilitates in consultation with the school, students and the feasibility study is currently underway.

New approach for community projects

We funded building a community/educational facility at Vishyamadu at a cost of about \$2,060. The facility is currently in operation. We are committed to support this Centre by employing two teachers to help needy students during after school hours. For this year (2014) we also funded for books, power connection to the centre, and roof repair works for an existing facility next to the one we built. The total contribution for this year towards this educational facility centre is about \$900. This project is being channelled through Ramakrishna Mission in Colombo.

We have also initiated another educational project in Vanni area through AssistRR. This project is to fund an after school tuition facility for G.C.E A/L students for the entire Mullaitivu zone (about 325 students in total). We have funded \$2,600 for this project which provides a nominal reward for the teachers.

We are currently investigating needs to fund feeder school to Hartley College. This will help those schools those have difficulties in raising fund as they do not have strong PPAs in overseas.

Recently members (including myself) of HCPPA NSW visited Homeland to see and report on the above projects and identify other needs. We are happy about overall progress and effectiveness of the above projects. We have gathered some information about those needs. We have shared some of the basic needs that we identified to a number of organisations and individuals who are undertaking similar projects back home. To our delight Anbalayam (a charity organisation here in Australia) immediately agreed to fund some of the projects. I would like to thank Anbaalayam for that. We also communicating with other potential sources who may want involve in these projects.

Community Projects by HCPPA(NSW)

SWAMI VIVEKANANDA EDUCATIONAL CENTRE VISVAMDU

Visvamadu Educational Centre run by Ramakrishna Mission is running very well. Our President Krishnakumaran and Treasurer Aravinthan visited the centre recently and met the teachers and students and very pleased with the efficient management of the centre.

We are committed to continue funding the teachers. Based on the request from Ramakrishna Mission Swamiji, Swami Ritamayananda, who is an old Hartleyite, we agreed to pay the cost of Honoraraium payment of Rs.96,000 to the teachers the year 2014, we are also funding the cost of books and work book cost of Rs.24,000. The existing cadjan roof of the second temporary building needed replacement and we are contributing Rs.25,000 for this purpose. Electricity connection cost of Rs.35,000 has also been paid. The committee also agreed to pay 100 English books at Rs.300 each.





AFTER SCHOOL TUITIONS IN MULLAITHIVU

HCPPA (NSW) is funding after School tuition classes at Puthukkudiyiruppu Maha Vidyalayam for 384 GCE(A/L) students in Mullaitivu district. Assist RR, www.assistrr.org a UK charity is running these classes with the help of Mullaithivu Educational Trust fund, run by Mullaitivu GA.

Majority of the students confirmed that they do not attend any other private lessons and depend on these tuition classes to improve their chances of enhancing their lives. The teachers are also glad that they participate in this initiative and helping these students

A large number of students are dropping out after sitting their O/L examinations in Vanni. There are only 408 students learning science subjects compared to 2176 students in O/L learning science subjects.

Assist RR believes that it could try and resolve this by encouraging them to follow A/L science subjects with the provision of free after school tuitions. Some mothers did tell Assist RR that their children opted to do arts/commerce subjects in GCE A/L because of their inability to pay for private tuition fees. They believe that these after School tuition classes would give them better chances of gaining admissions to universities.

LIBRARY BOOK DONATION TO SCHOOLS

Five Vadamarachi East schools have been identified as in need of essential books for their libraries. worth of \$940 will be handed over to the Principals of the respective schools through Vadamarachi East Undergraduate Student's union and supervised by a Hartleyite Mr Pasupathy Thayananthan.

SCHOOL FUNITURE REPAIRS

There are 135 Student tables and chairs including 70 Student Iron tables have been repaired. The photos are shown below of the repaired.


